

Guildford Borough has many reminders of his work re Alice in Wonderland. He was a frequent visitor having bought a house for his sisters in Guildford.









The final climb up to the Mount is where we were able to pay our respects to the author and mathematician's memory.

#### **Museum News**

The Museum's autumn exhibition, opened on September 22<sup>nd</sup>, is presented by Surrey Wildlife Trust as part of their Heritage Lottery Funded **Hedgerow Heritage** project.

The exhibition traces the history of hedgerows in Britain and their impact on the landscape and the rural trades and practices associated with them. It includes visuals and traditional hedging tools. The project aims to prevent further decline in

hedgerows in the Surrey Hills and the loss of wildlife habitat. SWT will also host practical sessions to demonstrate hedging techniques on selected dates during the course of the exhibition.

The spring exhibition, will run from January and traces the history of the charity **Sight for Surrey** which was founded in the aftermath of the First World War with Lord Ashcombe of Denbies as its President. It will be celebrating its centenary supporting visual and hearing impaired people throughout Surrey.
